STUDENT PARTICIPATION & ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- At least 16 years and a resident of Rock County, WI and be eligible to work in the U.S. and Rock County, WI.
- Entering your senior year of high school in Rock County
- Have parental and/or legal guardian consent
- Reliable transportation
- Active Academic & Career Plan (ACP)
- Students must commit to work at least 20 hours per week during their internship.
- Apply online and submit a completed application, including one reference letter from an existing school district staff or faculty member, **by no later than 4:30 PM on February 27, 2026.**
