

## 2023 ROCK INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

## PROGRAM INFORMATION

The 2023 Summer Rock Internship Program is an opportunity for rising High School Seniors to accelerate personal, as well as professional, skills development and career-related exposure. This structured, earn-and-learn (paid internship) model will provide students with a meaningful, career pathway experience that will serve as a foundational element of their Academic & Career Plan (ACP).

The program will last for a total of six weeks (30 hours per week)

February 17 Application Due Date

April 10-May 12 Internship Candidate Interviews

May 15-19 Employer & Intern Candidate Interviews and Confirmation of Worksite Placements

June 9 (or June 12) Internship Signing & Orientation Day

June 12-July 27 Interns Report to Worksites (Up to 30 Hours Per Week for Six Weeks)

July 3-7 Program Off (Observance of 4th of July Holiday)

July 28 Internship Graduation Day

## EMPLOYER PARTICIPATION & ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Allow individuals under the age of 18 into their place of business, as it concerns job shadowing and employment activities.
- Organizational capacity to serve as an intern worksite, as demonstrated by past/current earn-and-learn participation and/or other related experiential learning activities.
- In compliance with all applicable local, state and/or federal workplace rules and regulations.
- · Have an established and documented safety plan.
- Possess a corporate culture that values professional growth and development.
- Agree to work collaboratively and communicate frequently with the Internship Coordinator throughout the Rock Internship Program.
- Agree to strictly adhere, as well as enforce, the program's guidelines.
- Employers must agree to cover at least 50% of their financial, as well as technical, support for this
  program up to \$1,750.00 per intern. The remaining 50% of the program's cost will be covered by
  grant funding procured from the County of Rock.
